>> *Oeuvres de Frederic le Grand (Vols.1-33)*

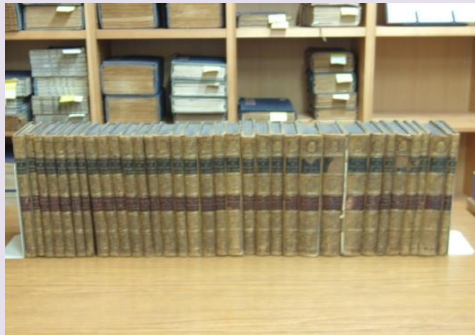
King Frederic, a Prussian King, was victorious in the War of the Austrian Succession and the Seven Years War. He advanced Prussia as a prominent power in Europe.

>> *Xenophone*

Xenophone was a Greek General around the turn of the 5th century B.C.. He was also a famous historian and philosopher. This book was written as a complete volume in Greek, then the Latin translation was added in 1555. The cover of this book is made from sheep's skin, and is highly valued as a rare book worldwide.

>> *Autographs*

This library has 90 autographs of important Japanese personalities. For example, Yoshida Syoin, Nogi Maresuke, Natsume Souseki, Katsu Kaishu, Yamaoka Tessyu, Katsura Taro, Togo Heihachiro, etc.



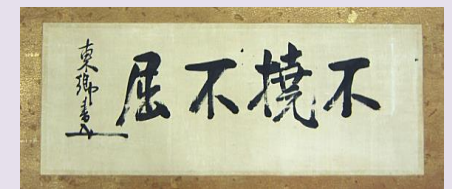

>> Arima Bunko (Japanese style book; 1,629 vols.)

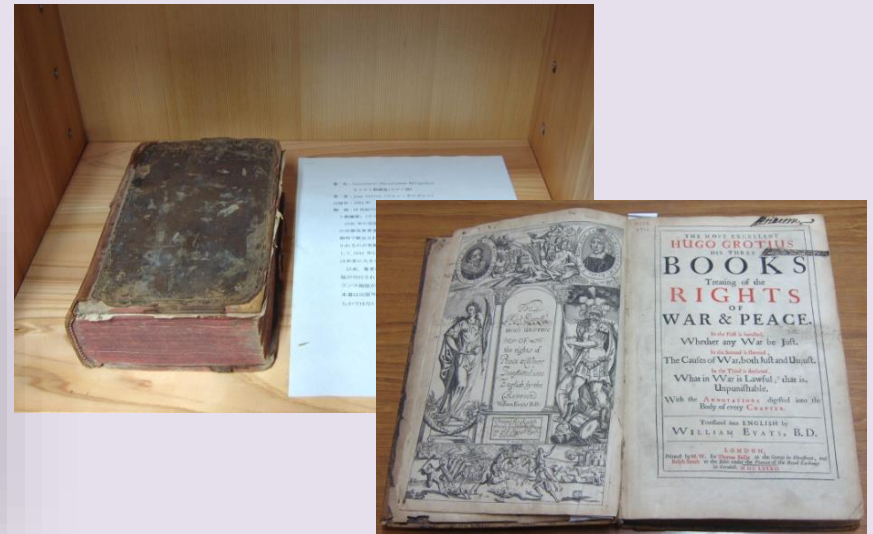
Mr. Arima Narisuke is an Retired Rear Admiral and a Military Science Researcher. He donated his collection of books about the military strategies of Old China, Korea, and Japan during the Edo period.

>> Maki Memorial Bunko (1,923 vols)

Mr. Maki Tomoo, the first president of NDA, donated his collection of books which consists of original books in philosophy, politics and history of thought by intellectuals of the Meiji period. His collection included two valuable English translated reprints, "Institutio Christianae Religionis (Latin; pub. in 1561)" by Calvin and "De Jure Belliac Pacis (Latin; pub. in 1625 and English; pub. in 1682)" by Grotius.
